

#### The Petition

The Petition was distributed throughout the Falkland Islands in May/June 2024.

#### Subject: Abolish or Reduce the VSAT Licence Fee and Approve Starlink Domestic Tariffs

We, the undersigned residents of the Falkland Islands, express our deep concern and outrage at the recent announcement by the Communications Regulator regarding VSAT Licences and the threat to prosecute Starlink users. Fast, reliable, and affordable internet access is a basic necessity in today's world, and it is vital for our community's connectivity, economy, and overall well-being.

#### Key Concerns:

- Fundamental Rights and Freedoms: Our Constitution guarantees the fundamental rights and freedoms of every person in the Falkland Islands, including freedom of expression and freedom from interference with the rights to receive and disseminate information. These rights also extend to our correspondence and other means of communication.
- Disproportionate Licence Fees: The current £5,400 annual licence fee for using alternative internet providers like Starlink is based on Sure's most expensive package and is excessively high. This fee, coupled with the threat of punitive fines up to £125,000, is effectively a ban for most residents on using alternative internet providers.
- Necessity in a Democratic Society: Such exorbitant fees and fines cannot be
  justified as reasonably necessary in a democratic society. They restrict our
  ability to choose more affordable and reliable internet options, impacting our
  daily lives and freedoms.

#### Our Demands:

- Abolish or Reduce the Licence Fee: We call on the Communications Regulator and MLAs to abolish the VSAT licence fee for using Starlink entirely. If a complete abolition is not feasible, we urge you to reduce the fee to a reasonable and proportionate level, not exceeding £180 per year.
- Approve Starlink Domestic Tariffs: We also call on the Communications Regulator to grant regulatory approval for Starlink to offer domestic tariffs in the Falkland Islands. This would prevent residents from being forced to rely on the more expensive global roaming tariffs, making fast and reliable internet access more affordable for everyone.

By addressing these concerns, you will not only uphold our constitutional rights but also ensure that the residents of the Falkland Islands have access to the internet services they need and deserve.

## **Key motivations for the Petition:**

- The headache of unreliable and glacial-speed broadband.
- Starlink's phenomenal success underscores the demand for highspeed internet in remote locations.
- The challenge of providing 21st-century broadband in Camp.
- Consumers, government & businesses now rely on Cloud services.
- An overly aggressive official stance was seemingly hindering progress.
- Consumer attitude to Starlink has changed dramatically.
- No one knew what was happening behind 'closed doors'.

#### **Petition demands**

#### 1. Abolish or reduce the 'VSAT' Licence fee.

- Most countries don't require a licence for satellite Internet access.
- A £5,400 licence fee policy to stop 'VSAT' uptake is unjustifiable in 2024.
- An obsolete law cannot restrain fast-evolving technologies.

#### 2. Gain immediate regulatory approval for Starlink usage.

- Enable legal use of Starlink in the Falkland Islands.
- Enable access to Starlink's low-cost residential tariff.
- Starlink adoption can be fast-tracked with FIG & MLA support.

#### **Petition progress**

• 10<sup>th</sup> May: A Petition was proposed following the Acting Regulator's email.

• 11<sup>th</sup> May: Starlink is a hot topic of media coverage like never before.

• 20<sup>th</sup> May: Starlink Petition was launched.

• 28<sup>th</sup> May: Starlink Petition FAQ document was published.

• 10<sup>th</sup> June: Statement by Andy Keeling: "We...have offered to provide regulatory

approval for Starlink operation. But we've not heard back".

• 28<sup>th</sup> June: After unprecedented publicity, the Petition closes.

• 25<sup>th</sup> July: The petition format ensures it can be formally presented to the

Legislative Assembly.

#### Benefits for non-Starlink users

While Starlink usage may initially seem detrimental, it will generate substantial benefits for remaining customers without additional investment.

**Reduced Network Congestion:** With fewer users sharing the infrastructure, there will be more bandwidth per user, potentially leading to faster internet speeds and improved performance.

**Enhanced reliability and Stability:** Reduced strain on the network will lead to fewer technical issues, fluctuations, and outages, improving overall reliability, i.e. better QoS.

**Competitive Pricing:** Sure could offer more competitive pricing or additional benefits, such as enhanced packages or discounts, to retain existing customers.

## **Comparing OneWeb and Starlink**

#### OneWeb's Role

- It's an additional Sure service capability for the islands.
- OneWeb focuses on businesses and governments.
- Due to lower 'spot beam' capacity, it cannot fully replace Intelsat.
- Likely to be delivered only in the form of business packages.

#### **Starlink's Advantages**

- Direct sales focus on residential customers and small businesses.
- Easy to install, even in remote locations in Camp.
- Demonstrated download speeds of around 300Mbit/s.
- Lower latency to London: [SL <80mS] [OW <300mS] [Geo 550mS].</li>
- One Starlink terminal can exceed OneWeb's total beam capacity.

#### **Entertainment**


- During winter, there's not much to do in town.

#### The effects of unreliable & slow Internet


- Long load times are very frustrating and increase our stress levels.


